of the two-stage ditch makes the Mahalasville culvert capacity before it is over the top of the road bringing the ditch up to that capacity and functions in unison with the culvert. This also allows the ditch to get down to grade at Artesian about a foot to 1 ½ feet lower then what is presently available. The construction estimate is 1.28 million. to the risk of back up. Through the course of the reconstruction a two-stage ditch is proposed which will take the top of bank15-20 feet additionally landward away from the ditch. The bottom of the ditch will 6-feet with a shelf and 3-1 slopes on each side, allowing mowing to occur a little more readily. The project itself would add approximately 11-acre feet of flood plain storage in the area to help reduce flooding risks. The added capacity ½ foot side slopes. The capacity of the ditch is about half of what the Mahalasville culvert is presently, leading condition of Hilldale Cemetery Ditch is about a 4-5-foot bottom width, close to 6 feet in some spots, with 1-1 reconstruction site extends from Mahalasville Road to Artesian Avenue, about 3,300 linear feet. roughly a \$2,500 assessment. Mr. Collier stated that Morgan is starting to get pressure to build, which means a lot more runoff with no where to go. Fortunately, obtaining the Readi Grant has removed a financial burden from the landowners and Mr. Collier is hopeful that by addressing the needed reconstruction now flooding will Mr. Collier stated that there is a 1.28 million-dollar Readi Grant covering the Reconstruction, had it not been available he would have anticipated a lot of opposition being present at the hearing. -Board Discussion

Mr. Hale stated that he is a big proponent for the two-stage ditch as he has seen the flooding that occurs. Mr. Hale expressed his understanding about the fear of compaction during the Reconstruction, but in the long run it will be beneficial for not only the Leonard's, but it is also what is best for the County.

Mr. Adams stated that with the work planned starting in February, compaction should not be a huge issue, but suggested that, after work is complete, the County should follow up with breaking the soil up to alleviate the compaction. Mr. Adams agreed that the Reconstruction has to occur in order to help with the continued growth of Martinsville.

Hilldale Cemetery Ditch was originally dug in 1891, Mr. Brock can find no evidence of the ditch ever being reconstructed, only maintained. Mr. Brock stated that the ditch was originally designed for farmlands; now half of the watershed is impervious area. With the planned addition of 280 homes in Hanna Farms, an additional 100+ homes to be built in Indian Creek Village, and the possible development of the Schwab's 90 acres, Hilldale Cemetery Ditch is not able to currently handle the added water and will lead to flooding.

Mr. Hale made a motion to approve the Reconstruction of Hilldale Cemetery Ditch. Mr. Adams seconded the motion, motion carried 3-0.
