1. Roll Call: On the call of the roll the following Commissioners were shown to be present: Jeff Pipkin, Troy Sprinkle, Brad Shields and Carole Snyder. Kim Merideth was absent. Dr. Jake Allen was absent. Attorney Steuerwald was virtual.

Commissioner Pipkin made the motion to approve the claims as presented. Commissioner Shields seconded the motion, which carried 4-0.

- 5. Public Comment: No public comment.
- **6.** <u>Legal Update:</u> Barnes & Thornburg will provide an update next month on changes to TIF after the legislative session. Attorney Steuerwald did note they were minimal.
- 7. <u>Economic Development Update:</u> Manns provide the April 15th report in written format. Per new statutory requirements, she presented to the County Council formally at its April meeting. She did share the following overview of 2023 accomplishments:

Adam Steuerwald, Partner at Barnes & Thornburg, was hired as legal counsel.

Ongoing work was done at the Waverly Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), including an influent sampler, SCADA improvements, spare UV disinfection parts, engineering work regarding sewer easements, and an asset management plan and start-up services for the new automatic sampler.

Additionally, sewer easements for the property were created by BLN. The Commission also explored how to best work with geographic partners.

The Commission did not pass through any excess TIF revenues.

A virtual meeting policy was approved for future use.

The Commission terminated and dissolved the existing Westpoint TIF area. They then created Westpoint TIF 2 and Westpoint TIF 3, also adding to the acquisition list. Additionally, the tax increment from the newly created Westpoint TIF 2 was pledged to Hendricks County bonds for associated infrastructure for a bi-county economic development project.

The Eagle Valley Enhancement Economic Development Area was amended. The amendment also created the Whetzel Trace Allocation Area.

Additional work was completed on Waverly Park.

Jason Semler of Baker Tilly provided the annual report to the underlying taxing units on behalf of the Commission.

Commissioner Pipkin made the motion to approve the April 15th annual report as presented. Commissioner Sprinkle seconded the motion, which caried 4-0.

- 8. Other Business: After some discussion on meeting times, Commissioner Sprinkle made the motion to move the meetings beginning in June to the second Tuesday of the month at 8:30. Commissioner Shields seconded he motion which carried 4-0.
- 9. Next meeting: The RDC noted the next meeting of the Commission will be Monday, May 13, 2024 at 8:30am.
- 10. Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned.
