Revision/Change of Approved Plat = \$250 Amendment (change to a recorded plat) = \$250

Site Plan Review – Preliminary or Final = \$250 Amendment to Approved Site Plan = \$150

All fees are non-refundable and are meant to cover the expense to the county for the outside engineering services. Jeff Quyle made a motion to adopt the ordinance establishing a fee schedule for the Morgan County Drainage Board. Seconded by Brian Goss. Motion carried 3-0.
