DRAINAGE BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT WERE TERRY BROCK (Surveyor), NORMAN VOYLES (Commissioner), AND BRIAN GOSS (Commissioner). ), JEFF QUYLE (Commissioner) WAS UNABLE TO ATTEND THIS MEETING.

\*Note: The Morgan County Drainage Board Meeting scheduled for 4/21/03 was cancelled, as Ashland Acres was not ready to proceed.

ASHLAND ACRES

Per Mr. Brock, Frank Stewart from DLZ sent an email to him stating that the drainage plan for Ashland Acres was appropriate at this time except for the erosion control and the flood line. Kevin Allen from Encompass Engineering was present and stated that he had the notice of intent letter regarding erosion control completed as well as the erosion control plan completed. Mr. Brock stated as long as Mr. Allen provides a copy of the permit and a copy of the plat, they have met all of the drainage requirements. Mr. Voyles clarified with Mr. Allen that the size of the culverts are (2) 54" corrugate metal pipes. Mr. Allen assured that this would take care of all backwater concerns exceeding IDNR requirements. Mr. Allen and Mr. Brock further explained the backwater flow models. Gina Ayers, resident in the area, questioned if her land would be flooded. Mr. Allen explained that according to his model/criteria, in the event of a maximum storm (3.1 inches of rain per hour), the water level would increase only two hundredths of a foot. Mr. Brock stated that based on DLZ recommendations, the drainage plan should be approved pending submission of erosion control and narrative. Brian Goss made a motion to approve the drainage plan for Ashland Acres with the stipulations mentioned by Mr. Brock. Seconded by Norman Voyles. Motion carried 2-0.

NUTTER DITCH


Per Mr. Brock, the State has granted permission to the county to begin work on Nutter Ditch. He stated that he is waiting for the permit from the Corps of Engineers. He stated that the State initially requested a field review as they thought Spring Lake was over ten acres; however, it was determined that it was not over ten acres. Therefore, a field review is not required. Mr. Brock further stated that if House Bill 1758 is signed, it would help in the area of wetlands.

ADJOURNMENT

Brian Goss motioned to adjourn. Seconded by Norman Voyles. Motion carried 2-0.
