The following indenture was filed & Recorded April 24<sup>th</sup> 1861  
First Indenture made this the Twenty fourth day of April  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four between  
Jefferson San and C. aged about one year old, Negro Servant  
of the Township of Baker county of Morgan and State  
of Indiana of the one part and John Burpo of said  
County of the other part witnesseth that the said Servant  
have and by these presents doth place now being out about  
a & a poor boy aged six years and eight months or  
thereabout days son of Nancy Burpo of said Township who  
is unable to support her said child as an apprentice  
to the said John Burpo to be taught the art brass  
trey and occupation of Farming which the said John  
Burpo now uses and to live with and serve him as an  
apprentice for the time of thirteen years and three  
months and fifteen days from the date of these presents the  
same to say until the said apprenticeship shall arrive  
to and be of the age of twenty years which shall be  
and be informed and believed will happen on the tenth  
day of May in the year 1867 if the said John Burpo  
so long lives and the said Servant doth by these presents  
give unto him the said John Burpo all the authority  
power and right to and over the said John Burpo  
and his service during said term which by the law  
of this State a Master hath to and over a minor  
indentured apprentice and the said John Burpo on  
his behalf the parties herein will provide
